## KEY TALKING POINTS

- The American Indian College Fund was founded in 1989; since then, they have provided over 131,000 scholarships to Native Students.
- When it comes to education, American Indians are the most underserved minority group. Currently only 14% of American Indians ages 25 and older have a college degree, less than half the national average.
- American Indian College Fund scholarships help Native students stay in school and complete their education while also providing programmatic support to ensure every dollar goes further.
- In 2017-2018, the American Indian College Fund provided 4,353 students with scholarships. Of those scholars, 36% are first in their families to go to college.
- The American Indian College Fund provides scholarships to help American Indians - of which 90% demonstrate financial need.
- The American Indian College Fund has provided more than 131,000 scholarships and more than \$201 million to support American Indian students' higher education ambitions.
- The American Indian College Fund's goal is to increase Native scholar's graduation to 60%.
- The American Indian College Fund is the nation's largest and highest-rated Native led American Indian nonprofit organization. They provide more scholarships to American Indians than anyone else.
